### INTRODUCTION

In November of 1992, the American Physical Society's Division of Fluid Mechanics hosted its annual Fluid Mechanics Photo Contest at the Florida State Conference Center in Tallahassee, Florida. This popular event offers conference participants a break from the traditional pace of the meeting by displaying a gallery of photographs and videos of the latest techniques in flow visualization.

Spanning a broad spectrum of problems unique to fluid mechanics, 55 entries were displayed this past November including visualizations from experiments and computational simulations.

Winning entries were selected by a distinguished panel of experts for excelling in artistic elements as well as in creativity and contribution to the field of fluid mechanics.

This special section of *Physics of Fluids A* features the winning entries from the tenth Annual Fluid Mechanics

Photo Contest. A narrative accompanies each entry to describe the uniqueness and creativity of the work.

Unfortunately, one of the winning entries entitled "Patterns and Quasipatterns in the Faraday Experiment" by W. Stuart Edwards is not included as we were unable to contact the author.
