The *Review of Scientific Instruments* is a monthly journal published by the American Institute of Physics and devoted to scientific instruments, apparatus, and techniques. Its contents include original and review articles on instruments in physics, chemistry, and the life sciences, book reviews, and sections on new instruments and new materials. One volume is published annually.

Submit manuscripts to Thomas H. Braid, Editor, *Review of Scientific Instruments*, Argonne National Laboratory, P.O. Box 290, Argonne, IL 60439. Submission is a representation that the manuscript has not been published previously nor currently submitted for publication elsewhere. The manuscript should be accompanied by a statement transferring copyright from the authors (or their employers—whoever holds the copyright) to AIP; a suitable form for copyright transfer is occasionally printed in the back of this journal and is also available from the Editor's office or AIP. This written transfer of copyright, which previously was assumed to be implicit in the act of submitting a manuscript, is necessary under the new (1978) U.S. copyright law in order for AIP to continue disseminating physics research results as widely as possible. Further information may be obtained from AIP.

Material for the **New Instruments** and **New Materials and Components** sections should be submitted, respectively, to Joshua Stern and R.K. Eby, Associate Editors, *Review of Scientific Instruments*, National Bureau of Standards, Washington, DC 20234.

Manuscripts should conform in style with the "Information for Contributors" printed in the January issue of the journal. Authors should also consult the *AIP Style Manual*, available from American Institute of Physics, 335 East 45th Street, New York, NY 10017 for \$7.50 prepaid.

Publication charge: To support the cost of wide dissemination of research results through publication of journal pages and production of a data base of articles, the author's institution is requested to pay a *page charge* of \$75 per page (with a one-page minimum) and an *article charge* of \$20 per article. The charge (if honored) entitles the author to 100 free reprints. For Errata the minimum page charge is \$10, with no article charge and no free reprints. Nonpayment of the publication charge may lead to delays in publication.

AIP's **Physics Auxiliary Publication Service (PAPS)** is a low-cost depository for material which is part of and supplementary to a published paper, but is too long to be included in the journal. Inquire of the Editor.

Proofs and all correspondence concerning papers accepted for publication should be addressed to the Editorial Supervisor, *Review of Scientific Instruments*, American Institute of Physics, 335 East 45th Street, New York, NY 10017. In all correspondence, reference should be made to title, author, journal, and scheduled date of issue. A limited number of **alterations in proof** are unavoidable, but the cost of making extensive alterations after the article has been set in type will be charged to the author.

Advertising rates will be supplied on request. Orders, advertising copy, and offset negatives should be sent to the American Institute of Physics.
